The Audubon Society of Great Denver has been connecting people with nature in the Denver community for over forty years. Our primary focus is birds, other wildlife, and the habitats of the South Platte Basin. We provide programming for all ages, from our popular Beginning Birding Class taught by Hugh and Urling Kingery - Colorado's foremost birders - to programs offered at schools and at the Audubon Nature Center at Chatfield. In January 2009, the nature center opened to the public on weekends and has since had over 3,500 visitors! We continue to expand public programs for children and adults with the theme: Get Out, Go WILD, Be Healthy.
